## **OBJECTIVES**

- Educating the public about the rules, benefits and enjoyment Cornhole can bring to a person's life.
- Establish and support training programs, equipment and funding to ensure people can learn the game of Cornhole.
- Providing and promoting an atmosphere of good spirit, fair play and respect for all event participants.
- Contribute to and promote an atmosphere that encourages and supports a game the entire family can play together.
- Develop and build a structure that promotes youth in learning the game of Cornhole. A structure that provides a low-cost game all ages can play.
- Expand our network of players, enthusiasts, and organizations.
- Fundraise and provide funding for leagues that support us in achieving our Mission Statement.
- Provide a vehicle for other groups to use Cornhole as a way to raise money for Charities, organizations, and groups.



#### **PROGRESS**

- Saskatchewan Cornhole Association (SCA) began it's Youth Initiative in 2024.
- In 2024, the SCA Youth Initiative team went to five (5) Regina High-schools, teaching cornhole to 25 separate PE classes, and hosted roughly 300 student to the SCA's venue - The BackYard.
- In 2025, to date, the SCA Youth Initiative team went to three (3) Regina High-schools, teaching cornhole to 15 separate PE classes, and hosted roughly 650 student to the SCA's venue - The BackYard
- Two (2) Regina High-schools have chosen to further integrate Cornhole through utilizing their wood shop classes to build cornhole boards.
- Working with these school to find mean to support funds for vinyl wraps and cornhole bags.
  - Recent partnerships with Lincoln's Life
     Mattered Foundation a foundation focused
     on youth mental health & suicide prevention.



#### **PARTNERSHIPS**

- To date these Saskatchewan Cornhole
   Association Youth Initiative partnerships are informal and relationship driven.
- Official policy, procedures, and /or partnership agreements maybe be needed as these partnerships continue to flourish.













#### **CONTINUED GOALS**

- Recent partnerships with Lincoln's Life Mattered Foundation; develop internal policies to further this partnership in the following ways:
  - Explore opportunities for bringing awareness to mental health & suicide prevention through the sport of cornhole.
  - Explore accessing funding through the foundation to support cornhole boards & bags in high schools, while highlighting mental health awareness & suicide prevention hotline #988
  - Support and direct funding to the foundation through the SCA's Backyard Training facility.
- Create internal policies to establish a cornhole bag recycle program through the SCA's Backyard Training facility.
   Recycled bags utilized for/by Youth initiative.
- Establish Youth Cornhole nights / Youth league nights at the SCA's Backyard facility.
- Develop &create appropriate funding policies and practices to support the SCA youth initiative.
- Support a High-School Cornhole Tournament in Regina and other Sask. High Schools.
- Develop & support a structure that has Cornhole as an intermural sport in Saskatchewan schools.
- Develop & support a structure that has Cornhole as part of the curriculum in Saskatchewan schools.



#### OPPORTUNITIES REGINA AREA

- The youth initiative is to introduce cornhole to the next generation of cornhole players.
- Any fees charged to the schools will be recorded and made available (as a credit) for the schools to access when requiring financial assistance with their purchase of cornhole boards and bags for their schools or their feeder schools.
- The goal of the Youth program is to have boards and bags in every high school in Saskatchewan and to be recognized as a school sport.

#### In School:

- The SCA will set up Cornhole boards in the school gymnasium, and cycle through the school's PE classes.
- The SCA will give a brief overview of the game, rules of cornhole, style of game play (both single & doubles game play), and how to throw a bag.
- Teachers will be provided a handout with thesame information & access to cornhole curriculum resources.
- o The remainder of the class will be time for students to play the game
  - Costs: \$500 a day (prorated based on the school's needs)

#### At the BackYard:

- Classes come to the BackYard for an hour
- The SCA will give a brief overview of the game, rules of cornhole, style of game play (both single & doubles game play), and how to throw a bag.
- Teachers will be provided a handout with thesame information & access to cornhole curriculum resources.
- The SCA will use the program at the BackYard to play games with random partners.
- The remainder of the class will be time for students to play games
  - \$100 per one-hour class



#### **BOARDS & BAGS PROGRAM**

- The SCA will work with individual schools to assist them in acquiring there own sets of cornhole boards and bags for student's use in the school.
- Schools will have access to the SCA curriculum resource guide, which provides curriculum outcomes for utilizing their workshop classes to build cornhole boards.
- The SCA, in partnership with the Lincoln Life Mattered Foundation, will provide financial assistance to cover costs associated with the wraps for the boards.
- These wraps will have the school logo, SCA logo, and a youth mental health awareness component, including the youth mental health crisis hotline number.
- The SCA will work with individual schools, to develop a system for schools to access financial assistance to support their purchase of cornhole boards and bags for their schools &/or their feeder schools.
  - NOTE: Bags with the school logo are also an option, but come with an upgraded cost.



## ADVANCEMENT OPPORTUNITIES

#### Special Olympics Sport

- Special Olympics Saskatchewan hosted two Baggo (Cornhole) tournaments (Regina & Saskatoon).
- 15 school's participate between the 2 tournaments, with over 180 Unified athletes and over 120 Unified athlete partners plus coaches.

#### Cornhole Canada & Canadian Cornhole League (CCL)

- National Championships
- Provincial Associations in most Canadian Provinces
  - Leagues & Associations offer local, regional & recreational tournaments.
  - Youth Initiatives are a primary focus of the CCL

#### American Cornhole League (ACL)

- ACL has various leagues, teams, directors offering local, regional, competitive & recreational tournaments.
  - American Collegiate & University level competitive and recreational intermural teams (through the ACL)
    - Beginning to offer scholarships



#### ADVANCEMENT OPPORTUNITIES

- The sport of cornhole is growing rapidly.
   Cornhole is widely considered one of the fastest-growing sports in North America.
   Opportunities that are currently available for all youth to advance in the sport of cornhole include:
  - Special Olympics Sport
  - Cornhole Canada
    - Canadian Cornhole Leagues (CCL)
  - Canadian Cornhole Federation (CCF)
  - American Cornhole League Canada (ACL Canada)
  - American Cornhole League (ACL)
    - American Collegiate & University level competitive and recreational intermural teams (through the ACL).
  - American Cornhole Association (ACO)













#### **BENEFITS OF SPORT**

- A healthy cornhole community promotes several protective factors for youth including:
  - Individual Protective Factors
    - Teach/learn effective coping and problemsolving skills
    - Support social-emotional learning programs
    - Support resilience
    - Promote strong sense of identity
    - Healthy behaviors & activities
  - Relationship Protective Factors
    - Promote healthy connections & feeling connected to others
    - Promote healthy peer norms
    - Connect youth to caring adults and healthy activities
  - Community & Societal Protective Factors
    - Create protective environments through healthy organizational policies and culture
    - Feeling connected to school, community, and other social institutions
    - Creating safe, stable, nurturing communities for all youth to thrive.
